

CALIFORNIA CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT DISCLOSURES AND RIGHTS

Your California Consumer Privacy Act Rights:

If you are a resident of the state of California, California Civil Code Section 1798.100 *et seq.*, the California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA), guarantees California resident consumers (hereinafter referred to as “you,” “your,” or “consumer”) you the following rights:

The Right to Receive Notice of the Collection of Your Information

California Civil Code Section 1798.100 guarantees you the right that businesses subject to the law, at or before the point of collection, inform you of the categories of personal information to be collected and the purposes for which those categories of personal information shall be used.

The Right to Request Information Collected About You

California Civil Code Sections 1798.100 and 1798.110 guarantee you the right to request that businesses subject to the law that have collected your personal information disclose:

- The categories of personal information collected;
- The categories of sources from which your personal information is collected;
- The business or commercial purpose for selling or collecting your information;
- The categories of third parties with whom consumers’ information is shared; and
- The specific pieces of personal information collected.

We will respond to verifiable consumer requests free of charge, which you may submit via the communications methods described below. Delivery of information in response to a request may take place electronically or by mail. We are not required to provide personal information to you more than twice in a 12-month period.

The Right to Request Your Information Sold or Disclosed For A Business Purpose

California Civil Code Section 1798.115 guarantees you the right to request that businesses subject to the law that sell or disclose your personal information for business purposes disclose to you:

- The categories of personal information that the business has collected about you;
- The categories of personal information sold about you, as well as the categories of third parties to whom the personal information was sold, by category of personal information for each party to whom information was sold; and
- The categories of personal information that have been disclosed for a business purpose.

The Right to Request the Deletion of Information Collected About You

California Civil Code Section 1798.105 guarantees you the right to request that businesses subject to the law delete any personal information about you that we have collected from you.

Upon receiving a verified request to delete your personal information, we will do so unless it is necessary to maintain your information to:

- Complete the transaction for which the personal information was collected, provide a good or service requested by you, or reasonably anticipated within the context of our ongoing business relationship with you, or otherwise perform a contract with you;
- Detect security incidents, protect against malicious, deceptive, fraudulent, or illegal activity, or prosecute those responsible for that activity;

- Debug to identify and repair errors that impair existing intended functionality;
- Exercise free speech, ensure the right of another consumer to exercise his or her right of free speech, or exercise another right provided for by law;
- Comply with the California Electronic Communications Privacy Act pursuant to Chapter 3.6 (commencing with Section 1546) of Title 12 of Part 2 of the Penal Code;
- Engage in public or peer-reviewed scientific, historical, or statistical research in the public interest that adheres to all other applicable ethics and privacy laws, when our deletion of the information is likely to render impossible or seriously impair the achievement of such research, if you have provided informed consent;
- To enable solely internal uses that are reasonably aligned with consumer expectations based on the consumer's relationship with the business;
- Comply with a legal obligation; and
- Otherwise use your personal information, internally, in a lawful manner that is compatible with the context in which you provided the information.

The Right to Non-Discrimination

California Civil Code Section 1798.125 prohibits us from discriminating against you for having exercised any of your rights on the CCPA, including by:

- Denying goods or services to you;
- Charging you different prices or rates for goods or services, including the use of discounts or other benefits, unless that difference is reasonably related to the value provided to us by your data;
- Providing a different level or quality of goods or services to you; and
- Suggesting that you will receive a different price or rate for goods or services or a different level or quality of goods and services.

The Right to Opt-Out to the Sale of Information

Dana does not sell your personal information.

Categories of Information Collected in the Last 12 Months

- Identifiers such as your real name, alias, postal address, unique personal identifier, online identifier, Internet Protocol address, email address, account name, or other similar identifiers;
- Information you voluntarily provide, including information about your gender, race or ethnicity;
- Commercial information, including records of personal property, products or services purchased, obtained, or considered, or other purchasing or consuming histories or tendencies, as far as they relate to your relationship with Dana;
- Internet or other electronic network activity information, including, but not limited to, browsing history, search history, and information regarding a consumer's interaction with an Internet Web site, application, or advertisement;
- Professional or employment-related information; and

- Inferences drawn from any of the information identified in this subdivision to create a profile about a consumer reflecting the consumer's preferences, characteristics, psychological trends, predispositions, behavior, attitudes, intelligence, abilities, and aptitudes.

Categories of Sources from Which We Collect Personal Information

The Dana Website collects personal information from the following categories of sources:

- Information you voluntarily provide;
- Information automatically collected via cookies, web logs, web beacons, and other analytics tools.

Business or Commercial Purpose for Collecting Your Information:

The Dana Website collects your personal information for the following purposes:

- To respond to, process, and communicate with you about your requests, inquiries, and comments;
- To manage your Product Selector Tool Account;
- To monitor and improve the essential functioning and performance of the Site;
- To facilitate our participation in ad networks;
- To protect against, identify and prevent fraud and other unlawful activity, claims and other liabilities; and
- To comply with applicable legal requirements, industry standards, and our own policies.

The Categories of Third Parties with Whom We Share Information

Dana shares personal information obtained through this Site with the following categories of third parties:

Categories of Information We Disclose for a Business Purpose:
